- A working party from Charles Sturt University(CSU) has been set up to try to determine how to badge CSU students.
- Victoria University Wellington (VUW) has a Mozilla badge framework set up for Staff in ICT training.
- Edith Cowan (ECU) has the same as VUW
- University of Southern Queensland (USQ) has also set up a working group looking into badges in Moodle
- University of Queensland (UQ) have also been looking into badges aligned with grades, but will probably use attributes and use badges in MOOC's
- Queensland University of Technology(QUT) have a collection of certificates but want to move away from this and take up badges
- Griffith University (GU) Also in a similar space, have their own development in Black Board (BB) but would prefer a learning sphere re digital literacies and have considered using badges.
